## Pastor's Note

My constant refrain – what ought to be the constant refrain of every preacher – is that we are called to give our entire lives to Jesus, to make him the center and foundation of our lives, and to make him and the Catholic faith the standard by which we evaluate all of our decisions about money, time, and action. But as much as I preach this and believe this, I still find myself surprised – authentically surprised! – every time I see it lived out.

What do I mean? When someone takes the leap of faith, gives Jesus the proverbial wheel, and becomes a true disciple of the Lord, we should expect to see changes in their lives, especially in the way they use their time and money (the most limited and fixed resources someone has). With time specifically, we should not be surprised that such a person uses more of their time in prayer, in liturgy, in study of the faith, but also in living the faith out through different meetings, ministries, activities, apostolates, etc. And I am privileged to see the truth of this every day living and working at our parish. Every day, I see people maintaining our buildings and grounds, serving our liturgies, helping in our office, teaching different classes, hosting different groups. The fact of volunteerism has become the water I swim in – it is ever-present and inescapable where I live and work.

And yet, I am constantly surprised by it. I know why I am here every day: I gave my life to the Lord in the priesthood, and this is now the totality of my life. But why would a person with a spouse, a family, a home, hobbies, a long-term network of friends, disposable income, built-up vacation, etc. – why would such a person choose to spend time here, at church, giving of themselves and their talents and their efforts? What could possess a person to give so much back to their parish and their church community? As dedicated as I am the rest of the staff are to our jobs, do we really deserve all of the efforts people put in to help us?

The answer is obviously Jesus and what I said above – Jesus changes lives, and that change has a concrete expression. But even though I spend every day preaching the Gospel of Jesus, I am still surprised that it actually takes root in peoples' lives. Rather than surprised, I suppose the better word is “delighted”. It is always a fresh experience and a fresh joy to know that people love the Lord enough to give their precious time away, week-in and week-out.

Thank you to all of our volunteers, who have responded so powerfully to the presence of Jesus in their lives! It would be impossible for this parish to carry out its mission of evangelization without you!

## Nota del Pastor

---

Mi estribillo constante, lo que debería ser el estribillo constante de todo predicador, es que estamos llamados a entregar toda nuestra vida a Jesús, a convertirlo en el centro y el fundamento de nuestras vidas, y a hacer de él y de la fe católica el estándar por el cual evaluamos todas nuestras decisiones sobre el dinero, el tiempo, Y acción. Pero por mucho que predique esto y crea esto, todavía me encuentro sorprendido, jauténticamente sorprendido! – cada vez que lo veo vivido.

¿A qué me refiero? Cuando alguien da el salto de fe, le da a Jesús la rueda proverbial y se convierte en un verdadero discípulo del Señor, debemos esperar ver cambios en sus vidas, especialmente en la forma en que usan su tiempo y dinero (los recursos más limitados y fijos que alguien tiene). Con el tiempo específicamente, no debemos sorprendernos de que tal persona use más de su tiempo en la oración, en la liturgia, en el estudio de la fe, pero también en vivir la fe a través de diferentes reuniones, ministerios, actividades, apostolados, etc. Y tengo el privilegio de ver la verdad de esto todos los días viviendo y trabajando en nuestra parroquia. Todos los días, veo personas manteniendo nuestros edificios y terrenos, sirviendo a nuestras liturgias, ayudando en nuestra oficina, enseñando diferentes clases, recibiendo diferentes grupos. El hecho del voluntariado se ha convertido en el agua en la que nadó: está siempre presente e ineludible donde vivo y trabajo.

Y, sin embargo, me sorprende constantemente. Sé por qué estoy aquí todos los días: entregué mi vida al Señor en el sacerdocio, y esta es ahora la totalidad de mi vida. Pero ¿por qué una persona con un cónyuge, una familia, un hogar, pasatiempos, una red a largo plazo de amigos, ingresos disponibles, vacaciones acumuladas, etc., por qué una persona así elegiría pasar tiempo aquí, en la iglesia, dando de sí misma y de sus talentos y sus esfuerzos? ¿Qué podría poseer una persona para devolver tanto a su parroquia y a su comunidad eclesiástica? Tan dedicado como yo estoy, el resto del personal está a nuestros trabajos, ¿realmente merecemos todos los esfuerzos que la gente pone para ayudarnos?

La respuesta es obviamente Jesús y lo que dije anteriormente: Jesús cambia vidas, y ese cambio tiene una expresión concreta. Pero a pesar de que paso todos los días predicando el Evangelio de Jesús, todavía me sorprende que realmente se arraigue en la vida de las personas. En lugar de sorprenderse, supongo que la mejor palabra es "encantado". Siempre es una experiencia y una alegría frescas saber que las personas aman al Señor lo suficiente como para dar su precioso tiempo fuera, semana tras semana.

¡Gracias a todos nuestros voluntarios, que han respondido tan poderosamente a la presencia de Jesús en sus vidas! ¡Sería imposible para esta parroquia llevar a cabo su misión de evangelización sin vosotros!
